

Use the map grid to find the general location of the site you are looking for. When you are in the neighborhood of the point, use your GPS receiver to help you get to the exact coordinates.

The straightest path is not always the best path! All locations are near a road or trail, so do not go through the lake or off a cliff! Traveling cross-country at Camp Tahuaya may bring you into contact with poison ivy or poison oak, so try to stay on roads or paths.

DO NOT ENTER OR CLIMB ON ANY STRUCTURES, OR CROSS ANY FENCES, OR TRY TO CROSS THE LAMPASAS RIVER! All of the GPS sites listed below are inside the fenced area of Camp Tahuaya.

Each location listed below has some distinctive feature, such as a building, a plaque, or a sign. Remember that even under the very best circumstances, typical hand-held GPS units are only accurate to perhaps 10-20 feet. So you may have to look around after you arrive at the correct GPS coordinates.

On the lines provided below, describe the notable feature at each of the GPS coordinates given. If you correctly describe what is at each site, you will earn a patch. Good luck on your quest!
