Kay's experiences with designing, implementing, and maintaining public-demonstration pollinator gardens have taught her many lessons that she will share with us in this presentation.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Kay earned a BS and MS in Forestry from Stephen F. Austin State University (SFA) and minored in Agriculture. She also earned an MS in Environmental Science from Texas A&M Corpus Christi. In her 18-year career with Texas Parks and Wildlife, she worked on resource management and habitat restoration projects on public lands.

Kay is a Master Naturalist and is the director of Master Naturalist training in East Texas in the fall of 2024. She joined the Tyler Chapter



of the Native Plant Society of Texas in 2009. She was awarded NPSOT's President's Award in 2016, and in 2017 she was presented with the Nancy Benedict Memorial Award for her leadership of a project to design and install monarch butterfly waystations at four TxDOT rest areas on IH-35 between Austin and Dallas.
